North Scott High School, in cooperation with local clubs and organizations, has created a common application form to assist eligible students in applying for local scholarships and grants. The application form is attached.

Please review the following key items to ensure eligibility for the scholarships and grants listed:

- The deadline for the scholarship applications is February 21, 2006. Applications should be turned into the high school Guidance Office.
- All **scholarships being applied for must be checked** on the next page of the application form. If a scholarship was inadvertently missed, the student **will NOT be considered** for that scholarship.
- The Alfred and Helen Arp Scholarship and the Joyce Brockhouse Family Scholarship are based on financial need. **Parents should file their Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form in January or February.** Upon receipt of the FAFSA form, the US Department of Education will send you a Student Aid Report (SAR). A **photocopy of the SAR form should be promptly submitted to the high school guidance office (copy can be made there).** Without this form, the applicant will not be considered for the above mentioned scholarships. *The FAFSA form can be completed online, without cost, at www.fafsa.ed.gov. A personal identification number (PIN) must be established before submitting FAFSA information online. You should apply for your PIN prior to completing your FAFSA online at, www.pin.ed.gov (PINs do not expire and one PIN can be used for multiple dependent children).*

SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED BY THE NORTH SCOTT EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION:

Need Based Scholarships

To be considered for the following two scholarships, a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) [available in the Guidance Office— *see front of application for more information*] must be submitted to the Department of Education, who will then send you a Student Aid Report (SAR).

Applicants must bring the SAR to the North Scott High School Guidance Office to be photocopied and included with this scholarship application.

North Scott High School will not be sent this information from the Department of Education. It is recommended that the FAFSA be completed in January or February to ensure that adequate time is allowed for the receipt of the SAR.

No student will be considered for the two scholarships below without an SAR. *Please check each scholarship for which you wish to be considered.*

- Alfred and Helen Arp Scholarship Fund*** — \$6,000 (4) Awarded to two male and two female students who will be attending an accredited four-year state-supported university in the state of Iowa (University of Iowa, Iowa State University, or the University of Northern Iowa).
- Joyce Brockhouse Family Scholarship*** — \$800

Other Scholarships

Elmer "Happy" and Evelyn Schlunsen Scholarships:

- \$6,000 (2) Awarded to students wanting to attend a 4-year institution of learning (i.e. university).
- \$4,000 (2) Awarded to students wanting to attend a 2-year institution of learning (i.e. community college).
- "Bear Stevens Scholarship - \$2,500 (2)** Awarded to one male and one female who have demonstrated leadership qualities and have been active in school and community activities. This scholarship is for any post high school education, i.e., technical school, community college, or 4-year college.
- Wilbert Schaff Scholarship** — \$1,000 (5)
- Bessie Sierk Scholarship** — \$1,000 (1) Awarded to a student who has been active in school and community activities and plans to pursue a degree in elementary education at an Iowa college or university.
- Melvin E. Heiler Scholarship Fund** — \$750 (2)
- North Scott Educational Foundation Scholarship Grant** — \$750 (3) Awarded to students who have demonstrated leadership qualities in their school and community.
- Wilma Zabel Scholarship** — \$750 (2) Awarded to a female student attending Scott Community College.
- Mike Richlen Memorial Grant** — \$600 (1) Equal consideration will be given to two-and four-year college applicants.
- Tina VandeWiele Memorial Scholarship** — \$525 (1) Awarded to a female student who has been active in school and community activities.

Roy and Myrtle Keppy Scholarships: Roy and Myrtle Keppy were life-long learners and did not have the opportunity to attend college. However, they share these "Friends of Agriculture" Scholarships to promote learning in all fields of study.

- \$500 (2) Awarded to a student wanting to attend a 4-year institution in any field of study.
- \$500 (1) Awarded to a student wanting to attend a 2-year college or technical school.
- \$500 (1) Awarded to a special needs high school graduate wanting to further their education.
- Judith Jacobs Performing Arts Scholarship** — \$500 (1) Awarded to a student with a 3.25 GPA or higher who has been active in three of the following: speech, drama, vocal music, instrumental music and/or dance. And, who plans to major in one of the performing arts or major in secondary education with a minor in one of the performing arts.
- Charlotte Mohr Scholarship** — \$500 (1) Awarded to a student entering the field of Nursing.
- North Scott High School Science Faculty Scholarship** — \$500 (1) Awarded to an individual who is hard-working, respectful and considerate of other students and the faculty, and who demonstrates an interest in furthering his/her education in the sciences.
- Schneckloth-Darland Memorial Scholarship** — \$500 (1) Awarded to a student whose major emphasis has been high school Business Education and who plans to further pursue education in the area of business.
- Jeff Mitchell Memorial Grant** — \$300 (1) Awarded to an education major.
